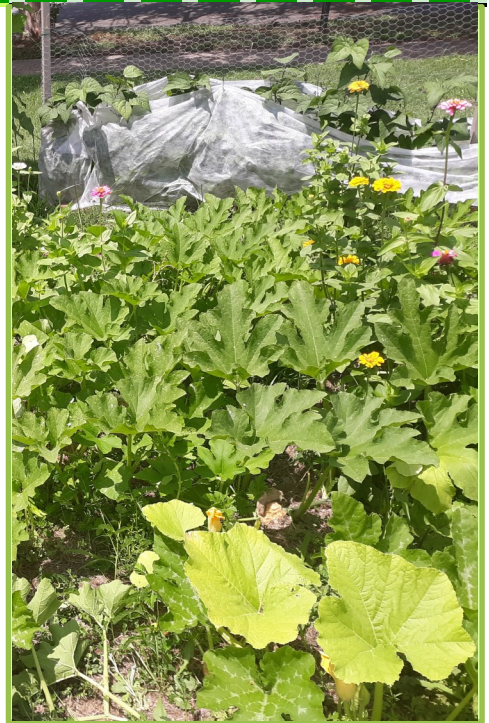
In South Hampton Roads, we have a third planting season!
